From Pastor Matt

In a past newsletter I shared a bit about how St. Peter was developed as an English speaking congregation of St. John's Lutheran Church in Dubuque. Like many families, when St. Peter grew, it also moved away from its original location downtown in the Flats, to up here on the Hill, where it grew into its own identity and mission. It also meant that many of those who joined generations later may be completely unaware of our existing relationship with St. John's.

After some exploration of needs in our community, and how St. Peter can share the love of Jesus into the Dubuque area, we realized **we had an already existing relationship with two very important service ministries at St. John's** – the Open Closet and Almost Home. In supporting St. John's, we will have chance to work closer with a local ELCA congregation (literally a family member), and to participate in two different, relevant, and important ministries in our area.

The Open Closet (1276 White Street, Dubuque) is a “free, retail shopping experience” open to the public in need, completely free of charge. The Open Closet serves over 14,000 people each year. Donations accepted Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday mornings 8am-11am, and the 1st & 3rd Saturday mornings. They will accept clothing, accessories in all sizes for men, women, children, and babies, as well as children's books and gently used toys. Donations of clothing, shoes, and some household items, are accepted and stocked by the Open Closet crew. **If you'd like to become involved**, ask Cindy Recker or Pastor Matt for further information.



Almost Home - is an incredible ministry that answered a real need in Dubuque – to provide housing to men with children, who are experiencing homelessness. Almost Home provides a safe and stable environment for dads with their children to get off of the streets and work toward a positive, long-term outcome. We provide case managers to work with dads to develop a plan for employment, parenting skills, and financial planning skills. We work with children to ensure their well-being, through caring adults who accompany them as they enter pre-school or attend school. **They are in real need of volunteers** who help provide hours at their front desk (*like a hotel, they need an attendant at all hours available.*) **Contact them at: sheltermanager@almosthomedbq.org or (563) 583-6572**

From Intern Pastor Shawn

“... I implore you by the mercies of God to prove to me by the writings of the prophets and apostles that I am in error...”

Luther’s ‘word alone’ theology is highlighted here, in his famous “here I stand” speech at the Diet of Worms. Given the opportunity to publically recant his writings and teachings, Luther refused. Whether Luther knew this moment would come or not, it was one that had a lifetime of preparation behind it.

Luther’s journey was much like Christ’s, and the irony must have been heavy for Luther. Luther’s overall speech resonates with John 18:23. **In Luther’s time, his refusal to recant his writings and teachings bore the risk of even death.** But, there was a whole lot working for good that falls behind the scene so to speak. He was not arrested because he had a letter of safe conduct which guaranteed him 21 days of safe travel, and he had good welcome in the towns he traveled through. The very fact he was invited to recant, had some workings behind it.

The reformation movement was something much bigger than Luther himself. There was an amazing amount of potential energy put into motion, that started at least a couple hundred years before, actually. A whole network of peoples, with a wide array of vocations and positions, bound together in what we know as the solas, made the reformation happen.

There is much to continue to hold fast to from the reformation movement. Not only the solas, which continues to inform our theology and practices in critically important ways, but the empowerment of the whole body of the church, of all different vocations, towards the goodness of God’s work.

Ephesians 2:8-10: *“For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God - not the result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are God’s workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.”*

Freed by the grace of God, may we continue the work, in all our different roles and vocations, to the glory of God alone. May the solas: Word Alone, Faith Alone, Grace Alone, Christ Alone, and all to the Glory of God Alone, inform not only our theology, but our very being. **Happy Reformation!**

The overriding intention of the Campaign this year is to have us move toward funding both of our Pastor positions through our regular budget and phase out the specific Pastor Fund. This will position us to have strong leadership and a vibrant youth program well into the future. Please help us get to this point starting in 2025 by increasing your regular giving.

In addition to the campaign, the Committee thought it would be a good idea to remind the congregation of our current St. Peter Gift Policy. 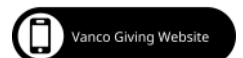
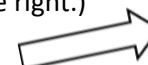
