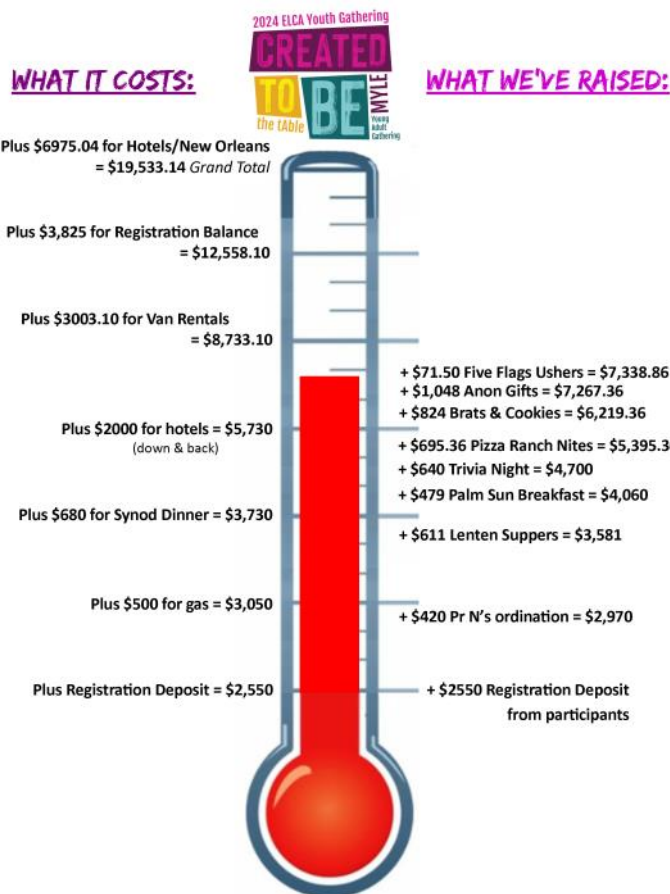
2024 ELCA Youth Gathering In New Orleans, July 16-20, 2024

From Pastor Matt

Weeping may linger for the night, but joy comes with the morning. Psalm 30:5

If you were to think about churches you've attended in the past, I'd wager that most of them had the congregation facing the east.

Since the church's earliest days, congregations have tended to be built so the people face toward the east, *ad orientem* in Latin, toward the rising sun. This became so standard that the idea of facing east eventually became built into our language.

To orient, or reorient oneself is to find the correct direction. An orientation is becoming familiar with a location. But each of these words is built off the idea of figuring out which way is east, *ad orientem*. In contrast, to face west is *ad occidental*. This tradition comes from a variety of sources. In the Bible, when Adam and Eve are cast out of the Garden, they are driven west – this Eden, paradise, is something toward the East. There has long been a practice that to face east is to face Jerusalem – regardless of your starting point. In Ezekiel, the glory of the Lord enters the Temples from the east.

But the most obvious reason is that the sun rises in the east – a metaphor for the resurrection. And it was at sunrise that the women discovered the tomb of Jesus was empty, and that Jesus was alive. Facing to the east was seen as a way to look toward the day when Jesus would come again.

However, St. Peter is the exception to the rule. Our church faces southwest. I assume this was a decision based on the property's location along the well-established Asbury Road. To face east is now more of a tradition than a hard and fast rule in church architecture. So next time you visit a church, take a moment to orient yourself!

FINANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE

As we head into the summer months, I thought it would be a good time for an update to the congregation on our church financials. **At the end of April, St. Peter is showing year to date expenses of \$177,000 against a budget of \$168,000.** The main driver of this expense overage is our church insurance. We budget \$11,000 for the year and have already made the annual lump sum payment. This results in an -\$8,000 difference at the end of April.

We are also showing an income of \$156,000 against a budget of \$164,000 at the end of April. This is due to an -\$8,000 difference in member donations. We are showing \$122,000 in member donations against a budget of \$130,000. **THANK YOU** to all who are keeping up with their weekly offerings. Your regular giving allows St. Peter to manage our church funds and carry out our mission throughout the year.

The Finance committee would ask those who have not kept up with your weekly giving to please work on getting current during the summer months. This will help us to better project if we will meet our annual financial commitments. **And don't forget that you can always set up your regular offering with Vanco/ACH** so you don't need to worry about that envelope each week!!! *(If you still need envelopes, contact the office, we have plenty left)*
