



Hallelujah, Christ is Risen!

During Lent, I'm often asked why Holden Evening Prayer includes a hymn that is associated with Christmas -Mary's Magnificat. Well, the answer is that particular passage is read as part of the Evening Prayer service EVERY NIGHT, all year. The Evening Prayer service is actually part of a fixed daily prayer schedule; each day is

split up into seven separate prayer services throughout the day, each with specific theme. They are all a bit different, but typically will include prayers, psalms, scripture and hymns, and typically will sing through all the psalms every two weeks.

These are sometimes called the Daily/Divine Office, Liturgy of the House, Opus Dei (No, not group mentioned in the Da Vinci Code, it's simply Latin for the Work of God).

Below is the list of the seven hours – the time for each of the services is traditionally based on Sunrise and Sunset, but since that varies, there is often a fixed time each day.

Matins/Vigil = 3am. This is a service in the middle of the night (Matins means morning in Latin). Thematically this service tends to focus on the longing for light in the darkness of the night, the end of time, and the second coming.

Lauds ≈ around sunrise. This is typically considered the Morning Prayer, typically focused on offering praise to God for a new day. The Canticle of Zachariah is read or sung.

Terce ≈ 9am. Third hour of daylight. Since Pentecost was at the "Third Hour", this service focuses on the work of Holy Spirit. Sext ≈ Noon. Sixth hour of daylight; This service is associated with the day of work, as well as the hour that Jesus was crucified. This is also origin of the word siesta.

None \approx 3pm. Ninth hour of daylight, and associated with the end of the work day. This is also the hour of Jesus death. Vespers ≈ 5:30pm. This is the Evening Prayer (Evensong) and the basis for Holden, and gives thanks for the day. The ancient hymn Glorious Light of Heavenly Glory (Phos Hilaron) and Mary's Magnificat are both included every evening. Compline ≈ 7:30pm. Prayer from Luke 2:29-32, and asks for God's protection through the night.

In our current hymnal we include three of these services, Morning (Lauds), Evening, and Night Prayer.

Christ the Priest

Having examined the ways that Christ fulfils the role of a prophet, we will now dwell on Christ as a priest. Now, I am aware that this idea may be confusing. We do not have priests in the Lutheran tradition. We also know of other denominations and religions that do have them. So it might seem strange or uncomfortable to think of Christ in this way as a Lutheran.

However, the title of priest itself is not so important, but the function that the one who holds that office performs is. We have people who perform 'priestly' duties in our tradition, though we don't use the title of priest. In the Hebrew Bible, or Old Testament, priests play a very prominent role. Israel's first priest was Aaron, Moses' brother, and the tribe of Levi was a tribe of priests. Aaron and the Levites were appointed by God to serve this role.

Their job was to serve as the intermediary between God and God's chosen people, Israel. They oversaw the sacrificial system, which was established by God to ritually cleanse the Israelites so that they could live in God's presence. Instead of offering sacrifices to God on behalf of us, Christ fulfils the priestly calling by being simultaneously the priest and the sacrifice. We read in Hebrews that, "he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek" (Hebrews 5:8-10).

Christ's sacrifice is also unlike the temple sacrifices in another sense. Whereas, one would need to return to the priest periodically to offer sacrifices, Christ's one sacrifice on the cross was sufficient for the cleansing of the entire world's sin. We return again to Hebrews. "Every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, 'he sat down at the right hand of God,' and since then has been waiting 'until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet.' For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified." (Hebrews 10:11-14)

The kids will decorate the boxes during VBS week and always enjoy filling them with the items. The Food Pantry just loves getting these to pass out, too!



From Pastor Nichole



I have been thinking a lot about prayer recently. My prayer practice has been just that... a practice, sometimes it is stronger and is made up of open to the spirit prayers and sometimes I fall into the thought process that if I pray for something God will give it to me. God is not a genie in a bottle waiting to grant wishes. I have heard over the years **the concept that God answers prayers in three ways, Yes, No, or Not Yet.** That is a simple way of looking at how prayers are answered, the hard part is being open to what those answers actually mean and how they manifest in our lives. **There are many ways to pray** and as I tell the Confirmation Students, your

prayer does not have to be fancy. Talk to God.... Ask someone else to talk to God on your behalf if you do not know what to say or how to say it. I have one person I have known since I was little that I know to be a fervent and faithful prayer and I have asked her over the years on many occasions to pray for me in my big life moments.

When I opened my study Bible to the back to look at the topic of prayer and where in the Bible prayer is found, I came across a list of 13 topics on prayer that reference to different Bible passages.

The topics listed looked to me like a free verse poem so I share it here for you:

- If we pray, then God will hear...
- How to pray...
- Jesus prays in Gethsemane...
- Spirit helps when we can't pray...
- Pray without ceasing...
- Pray with confidence...
- The Lord hears prayer...
- God answers prayer...
- The Lord's Prayer...
- Ask in prayer...
- Persist in prayer...
- The power of prayer...
- God is attentive to our prayers...



Prayer is a conversation with God, and in that conversation, we have the opportunity to release what is on our hearts in the hope that through the will of God our prayers will be answered faithfully. And if you find yourself not knowing what to pray remember that when the disciples said "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciple" Jesus responded with "when you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive everyone indebted to us. And do not bring us to the time of trial." (*Luke 11:1-4*)




